1. Taj Mahal, Agra

The Taj Mahal is India's most recognizable building and world's most famous testimony to the power of love.

The beautiful mausoleum was begun upon the death of Mumtaz Mahal, the favourite wife of Emperor Shah Jahan.

The Monument was built incorporating many elements of Islamic design including minarets, arches, black calligraphy inlaid around the entrance, an onion-shaped dome. It is largely constructed with delicate inlaid floral patterns and precious and semi-precious stones such as lapis lazuli, jade, mother of pearl and diamonds.






2. Varanasi, Uttar Pradesh


11. Khajuraho, Madhya Pradesh

The Khajuraho is a group of Hindu temples and Jain temples in Chhatarpur district, Madhya Pradesh.

They are a UNESCO World Heritage Site. The temples are famous for their nagara-style architectural symbolism and their erotic sculptures.

Most Khajuraho temples were built between 950 AD and 1050 AD by the Chandela dynasty. Historical records note that the Khajuraho temple site had 85 temples by the 12th century, spread over 20 sq.km. Of these, only about 25 temples have survived, spread over 6 sq.km. Of the surviving temples, the Kandariya Mahadeva Temple is decorated with a profusion of sculptures with intricate details, symbolism and expressiveness of ancient Indian art.

12. Meenakshi Temple, Madurai

The historical Meenakshi Amman temple is located on the southern bank of the Vaigai River, Madurai, Tamil Nadu.

Built sometime between the year 1623 and 1655, the wonderful architecture of the place is renowned globally. Meenakshi Temple is dedicated to Parvati, known as Meenakshi, and her spouse, Shiva. What makes this temple different from the others is the fact that both God and Goddess are worshipped together.

According to the mythology, Lord Shiva visited Madurai to marry Parvati and it has been the sacred abode of Goddess since her birth. The most striking feature of the temple is its exquisite façade, which has highly minute details with great art pieces incorporated in the walls and pillars. The temple has 14 gateway towers or 'gopuram', golden 'vimanas', holy sanctums and shrines dedicated to the revered Goddess Meenakshi and many others. It is a major tourist attraction with thousands of devotees visiting the shrine on a daily basis.




13. Mysore Palace, Mysuru

Mysore Palace, also called Amba Vilas Palace, is one of the most magnificent and largest palaces in India.

Situated in the southern state of Karnataka, it used to be the official residence of the Wodeyar Dynasty, the rulers of Mysore from 1399 to 1950. The grand palace stands tall in the heart of Mysore city and attracts visitors from across the world. Built in the Indo-Saracenic style with a touch of Hindu, Mughal, Rajput and Gothic architectural styles, the 3-storied tower was built using fine grey granite while deep pink marble was used for the domes. Being one of the prime attractions in India after the Taj Mahal, it certainly deserves a place in every traveller's bucket list.



14. Qutub Minar, Delhi

The Qutub Minar is a towering 73 meter high tower built by Qutub-ud-Din Aibak in 1193.

The tower was built to celebrate Muslim dominance in Delhi after the defeat of Delhi's last Hindu ruler. This tower is the highest tower in India, complete with 5-storeys and projecting balconies. The first three storeys of the Qutub Minar are made of red sandstone and the last two are made of marble and sandstone.

The different architectural styles from the time of Aibak to Tuglak are clearly visible in the Qutub Minar. Apart from the tower, the Qutub Minar complex comprises of the Quwwat-us-Islam Mosque (the first mosque built in India), a 7 metre high iron pillar, and the tomb of Iltutmish, Ala'i-Darwaza and the Ala'l Minar.




15. Darjeeling



17. Gateway of India, Mumbai


The Gateway of India with its regal arches, stands guard facing the Arabian Sea at Apollo Bunder in bustling Colaba area of Mumbai.






