


























# **1** Statue of Unity, Kevadia

tatue of Unity is a memorial to the iron man of India, Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel. The Statue has been erected to propagate Sardar Patel's vision of India and to inspire the citizens of India through his patriotism and freedom struggle. The bronze statue stands tall at 182 metres, grabbing the attention of the whole world as the "Tallest Statue in the World". The Statue of Unity is located in Gujarat on the river island of Sadhu Bet overlooking the Sardar Sarovar Dam from 3.2 km.



# Rani Ki Vav, Patan

An Archaeological Wonder





ani ki Vav or Ranki vav is a stepwell situated in the town of Patan in Gujarat state of India. Its construction is attributed to Udayamati, daughter of Khengara of Saurashtra, queen of the 11thcentury Chaulukya dynasty and spouse of Bhima I. Silted over, it was rediscovered in 1940s and restored in 1980s by the Archaeological Survey of India. It has been listed as one of UNESCO's World Heritage Sites since 2014.

Rani ki vav is considered as the finest and one of the largest example of stepwell architecture in Gujarat. It was built at the

height of craftsmens' ability in stepwell construction and the Maru-Gurjara architecture style, reflecting mastery of this complex technique and beauty of detail and proportions. The architecture and sculptures is similar to the Vimalavasahi temple on Mount Abu and Sun temple at Modhera.

The stepwell is divided into seven levels of stairs with sculptural panels; more than 500 principle sculptures and over a thousand minor ones combine religious, mythological and secular imagery.

Gir Forest National Park is an ultimate destination for nature and wildlife enthusiasts. Excess hunting of lion made them the most endangered species of the 1900. Gir National Park was established to protect Asiatic lions who frequent the fences-off Devalia Safari Park, along with leopards and antelopes. Gir Jungle Trail, outside the fenced area, traverses deciduous forest and is home to wildlife including vultures and pythons. The Kamleshwar Dam has marsh crocodiles and birds, such as

he Somanth temple, located in Prabhas Patan near Junagadh in Saurashtra, is believed to be the first among the first among the twelve jyotirlinga shrines of Shiva. It is an important pilgrimage and tourist spot of Gujarat. Reconstructed several times in the past after repeated destruction by several invaders and rulers, the present temple was reconstructed in Chalukya style of Hindu temple architecture and completed in 1951.

The temple's shikhara or main spire, is 15 metres in height. The temple's imposing architecture includes intricate carvings, silver doors, an impressive Nandi idol and the central shivalinga. In the vast courtyard stand the massive mandapa as well as the main shrine, whose gently curved pyramidal forms tower over the whole complex.


# Polo Monument and Vijaynagar Forest

Into the Lush Greenery





hampaner-Pavagadh Archaeological Park, a UNESCO World Heritage, is located in Panchmahal district. It is located around the historical city of Champaner, a city which was founded by Vanraj Chavda, the most prominent kind of the Chavda Dynasty, in the 8th century.

The heritage site is studded with forts with bastions starting from the hills of Pavagadh, and extending into the city of Champaner. The park's landscape includes archaeological, historical and living cultural heritage monuments such as chalcolithic sites, a hill fortress of an early Hindu capital, and remains of the 16th-century capital of the state of Gujarat. There are palaces, entrance gates and arches, mosques, tombs and temples, residential complexes, agricultural structures and water installations such as stepwell and tanks, dating back from 8th to the 14th centuries.





This was one of the main residences of Mahatma Gandhi who lived at Sabarmati and Sevagram (Maharashtra) when he was not travelling across India. Gandhiji stayed at the ashram from 1915 to 1933 later on the ashram was disbanded. The ashram is a witness to many important historical events.

An important feature of the ashram is Gandhi Sangrahalaya, a museum inaugurated by Jawaharlal Nehru in 1963. It has five units and a library, two pjoto galleries and an auditorium.



# 10 Marine National Park, Jamnagar The Fascinating Underwater World


Marine National Park

The Marine National Park & Sanctuary has coral reefs, mangroves, sea-grass beds, mudflats, network of creeks and other ecosystems which support rich marine life & bird life.

Here one has a chance to spot octopus, puffer fish, sea turtles, lobsters, crabs, dolphins, ray fishes, jelly fish, star fish, sea anemones, colourful corals, exotic marine flowering plants, etc.

# 12 Dholavira Know More About Indus Valley

holavira is the larger of the two remarkable excavations of the Indus Valley Civilization or Harappan Culture, dating back to 4500 years ago. Surrounded by the Great Rann of Kutch , it offers a unique insight into the pioneering Harappan mind, with one of the world's earliest and best planned water conservation systems and what might be the

world's first signboards, written in ancient Indus script.

The excavation also tells the story of the 7 stages of the civilization, from development to maturity to decay, the last of which hints at a strange piece of history. After the peak of the civilization, Dholavira was temporarily abandoned, after which it seems that the settlers returned with a markedly de-urbanized culture.




# Lothal Dig Into The Ancient Era

othal was excavated during 1954-1960 by the Archaeological Survey of India. Situated near the village of Saragwala in the Dholka Taluka of Ahmedabad district, Lothal was a vital and thriving trade centre in ancient times, with its trade of beads, gems and valuable ornaments reaching the far corners of west Asia and Africa. The techniques and

tools they pioneered for bead-making and in metallurgy have stood the test of time for over 4000 years.

The excavation of this site was resumed in 1961 which unearthed trenches sunk on the northern, eastern, and western flanks of the mound, bringing to light the inlet channels and nullah connecting the dock with the river. The findings consist of a mound, a township, a marketplace, and the dock. Adjacent to excavated areas stand the Archaeological Museum, where some of the most prominent collections of Indusera antiquities in India are displayed.



# Pols of Ahmedabad


UNESCO World Heritage City

he walled city of Ahmadabad, founded by Sultan Ahmad Shah in the 15th century, on the eastern bank of the Sabarmati river, presents a rich architectural heritage from the sultanate period, notably the Bhadra citadel, the walls and gates of the Fort city and numerous mosques and tombs as well as important Hindu and Jain temples of later periods. The city continued to flourish as the capital of the the city to expand, a short section of the wall along the Sabarmati River and the original 12 gates bearing State of Gujarat for six centuries, up to the present.

Although much of the late 15th century wall built to fortify the city had to be later dismantled to allow carvings and calligraphy, some with balconies, still exist.

Attractions like Jhulta Minars (Shaking Minarets) stand as examples of India's engineering feat. If one minaret of the pair is shaken, the other one shakes too.

Some of the key attractions that reveal the Indo-Islamic architecture are the Jama Masjid, Teen Darwaja, the Bhadra Gate, the King's and the Queen's tombs, etc. Buildings from the Maratha period and the colonial era also survive in the walled city.


# **Velavadar Blackbuck** National Park, Velavadar, Bhavnagar

The Wild Side


t a distance of 45 km from Bhavnagar, Blackbuck National Park is a national park located at Velavadar. Also known as Velavadar Blackbuck National Park, it is one of the famous places of wildlife in Guiarat.

The park has been established for the protection of the blackbucks and has the highest number of blackbucks in India. More than 3, 000 black bucks exist on the open grasslands of Velavadar. The sanctuary is also home to other animals like nilgai, jackal, wolf, jungle cat, and fox. Besides, one can also spot many bird species which include pelicans, flamingos, white and painted storks, three kinds of cranes, many birds of prey, and the rare Stolizca's Bushchat in the southern part of the park, where all the wetlands lie. The extremely rare Lesser Florican, one of the 50 rarest birds in the world, breeds here. In the winter, thousands of migratory birds from Central Asia, Siberia and Europe land here to escape the extreme weather conditions.


A wildlife safari to this National Park is sure to prove a lifetime memory for its visitors as it allows you to watch the abundant wildlife of the region very closely.










# Unique and Historic

he "Buddhist Caves" around Uparkot are not actually caves, but three separate sites of rooms carved out of stone to be used as monks' quarters, hence the name. They are all a little over 2000 years old, give or take a couple of centuries.

The oldest, the Khapara Kodia caves belong to 3rd-4th century AD and are plainest of all cave groups. These caves are along the edge of the ancient Sudarshan Lake (which no longer exists) and the northern side of Uparkot. They were carved into living rock during the reign of Emperor Ashoka and are considered the earliest monastic settlement in the area. After many years of use, they were abandoned because cracks above them allowed water to seep into living quarters, rendering them unusable. Khapara Kodia was damaged by later quarrying, and now only the highest story remains.

Across Uparkot from Khapara Kodia are the caves of Baba Pyara. Baba Pyara caves are lying close to the Modhimath, which has four caves in its northern group. The next set of south group caves has a unified plan with a spacious court and a chaitya hall. The art tradition of Satavahanas period has influence over these cave pillars and door jambs of the caves.





20 Palitana A Holy Place Palitana is one of the holiest places for followers of Jainism. The Palitana temple lies atop the Shatrunjaya Mountain, much in accordance with Jain philosophy which believes that the holiest places are to be found in the skies rather than on land. Reaching the temple, however, requires one to undertake an arduous climb involving over 3,000 stairs.


It is believed that the construction of Palitana Temples spanned over a period of 900 years and was completed in two phases. The idols in the temple are bathed around 9.30 pm, and prayers are offered around noon. It would be better if you began your climb in the morning, when the heat is moderate and gives you plenty of time to explore the mountains.
